Private providers must budget this additional allocation, at a minimum, for workforce initiatives such as recruitment/on-boarding expenses (e.g., \$250 as a signing bonus, \$300 for onboarding), retention/upskilling (e.g., \$500 as a retention bonus after 6 months employment and completing the 45 hours of DCF training, monthly teacher stipend that incentivizes retention and helps with increased hourly wages).
