### 2016-2017 VPK Provider Readiness Rates



OEL releases readiness rates based on new assessment tool

The Office of Early Learning announced that on May 16, 2018, the State Board of Education approved Rule 6M-8.601, F.A.C., Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate. As a result, each provider's 2016-17 VPK Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate has been released on the VPK Program Provider Kindergarten Readiness Rate Website: <a href="https://vpk.fldoe.org/Default2.aspx">https://vpk.fldoe.org/Default2.aspx</a>, which is publicly searchable.

The Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener (FLKRS) tool used to create the 2016-17 readiness rate, Star Early Literacy, is new and therefore the score standard is new. To be considered ready for kindergarten, a child's score must be at least 500. <u>Click here</u> to read the FAQ about FLKRS.

For the 2016-17 and 2017-18 Readiness Rate, no new providers will be placed on probation. However, a readiness rate of less than 60 is low performing and providers should strongly consider rigorous, yet developmentally appropriate improvements to their VPK instructional practices for the 2018-19 program year.

Coalition sees positive results after year of using LENA technology In October 2016, the ELC of Escambia County launched a partnership with LENA Grow to explore the use of LENA technology in child care settings. This month, LENA presented the results from the first year at The Association of Early Learning Coalitions conference in Orlando.

The results presented are also summarized in a report on year one from the coalition, "Results & Lessons Learned from the First Year of LENA Grow™" as part of the ELC of Escambia's 'Grow with Me' Initiative." Among other outcomes, data



from the first year indicate that classrooms using LENA Grow, a professional development program for early childhood educators, showed gains on Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS®) scores.

# Partnership with performing arts hall helps coalition integrate art into learning

## Program promotes literacy, creativity and artistic knowledge

Five years ago, the **ELC of Sarasota** partnered with the Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall. The coalition targeted preschools that serve a high percentage of school readiness kids. The teachers and directors attend a professional training at Van Wezel to learn art integration strategies.

During their most recent training, the focus was on pantomime, soundscapes and character features. After the training, each teacher took home a copy of the book "The Gruffalo" to read and share in their



classroom. The teachers used the skills they learned during training to help teach the book to their students. Ms. Laura, from Van Wezel, visited the classrooms twice to expand upon the art integration pieces.

The children's families were invited to attend a family literacy night at the Van Wezel Grand Foyer, where dinner was provided and the families were also introduced to the art integration skills their children learned. At the end of the night, each child was given a copy of the book to read with their family and build their home library. Finally, the children attended a performance of "The Gruffalo" to see the story unfold on the stage.


### Coalition to hold 11th Annual Early Childhood Conference
